### QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify as a student election judge you must be:

- ♦ 16 years old and either a junior or senior;
- ♦ Physically and mentally able to perform your duties;
- ♦ U.S. citizen on Election Day;
- ♦ Free of any conviction for fraud or election offenses;
- ♦ Not a family member of a candidate on the ballot;

### RESPONSIBILITIES:

As a student election judge you will serve alongside other adult election judges at a polling place in your county.

Some of the duties student election judges assist with are:

- ♦ Opening and closing the polls. (Election judges work from 6:00 a.m. to about 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.)
- ♦ Ensuring that qualified voters are permitted to vote.
- ♦ Checking in and processing voters.
- ♦ Assisting with the registration of those people who are qualified and who have not registered to vote before Election Day.
- ♦ Distributing ballots.
- ♦ Helping voters who need assistance.
- ♦ Answering voters' questions.
- ♦ Maintaining order in the polling place on Election Day.
- ♦ Obtaining results after the polls are closed.

### HOW TO APPLY:

**Apply early!** If hired as a student election judge, you will have training prior to Election Day.

- ♦ Fill out the application at the bottom of the page.
- ♦ Make sure your parent or guardian and school official signs the "Permission" portion.
- ♦ Send the application to your local county clerk.
- ♦ Check with your school official or administrator to find out the school policy on requesting an absence from school.
- ♦ You will receive a call from your county clerk letting you know if your application has been approved. The clerk will inform you of the date and time of the training class.
- ♦ Work at the polls on Election Day!

**Remember...** When you turn 18 you may register to vote and serve as a regular adult election judge!
